Speech and Language Therapist: Early intervention to address on of our key areas of need on starting school.

Cost: £4750

Aims/Outcomes: A greater numbers of pupils are at ARE for S&L in order to positively impact phonics and writing.

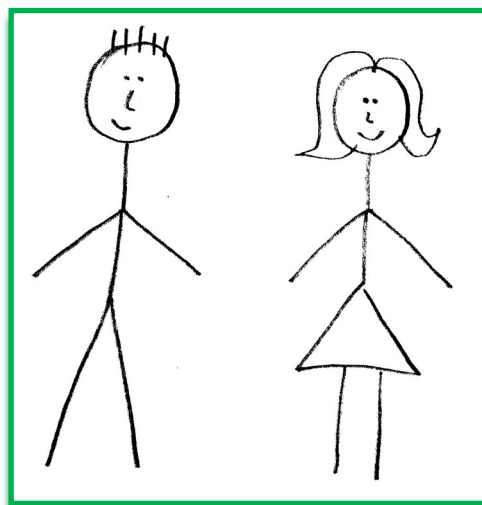
School Librarian: The school library is in use at all times and all pupils a have access to fiction and non fiction texts. Accelerated reader is embed in the school.

Cost: £3252

Aims/Outcomes: Barriers to accessing texts are removed. Improved reading progress over time.

Apprentice in Early Years: Early intervention to make sure children in reception make the best start in school.

Cost: £7080

Aims/Outcomes: Increase progress and independence leading to a greater number of PP pupils reaching GLD.

Nurture class: A nurture class that runs 4x per week to meet the needs of vulnerable pupils with social, emotional and mental health needs.

Cost: £8724

Aims/Outcomes: Children make progress against the Boxall and are able to access whole class teaching every morning.

Preteaching sessions: Sessions before school to ensure that Y6 pupils are prepared for the demands of the secondary curriculum.

Cost: £8250

Aims/Outcomes: Increased progress and confidence in English and Mathematics leading to a greater number of pupils making better than expected progress.

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IRIS Connect: An online platform which allows filming of lessons to evaluate teaching and impact of SMARTER strategy.

Cost: £2000

Aims/Outcomes: The SMARTER strategy and high quality teaching leads to closing of the gap for vulnerable pupils.

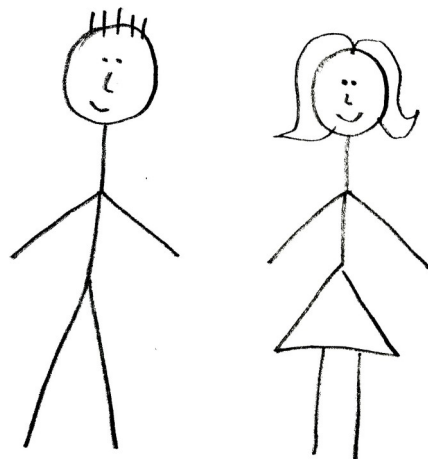
Structure English and Maths Intervention: TA to run interventions in maths and English 5 afternoons/ week.

Cost: £10,000

Aims/Outcomes: Gaps are quickly identified and closed. Children provided with additional opportunities for determined practice.

Key Workers: The most vulnerable pupils are allocated a key worker to ensure that they are held in mind each day and that home reading and extra activities are completed in school.

Cost: £7488

Aims/Outcomes: Any barriers to home learning or additional practice are removed and FSM children make good progress.

Computers/lpads/Accelerated reader subscription: New and additional equipment to ensure that Accelerated Reader can be used.

Cost: £10,000

Aims/Outcomes: Texts are well matched to children's current level and progress in reading improves.

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Behaviour and Inclusion Support Service: Pupils with social, emotional and mental health challenges are identified early and barriers to learning are removed.

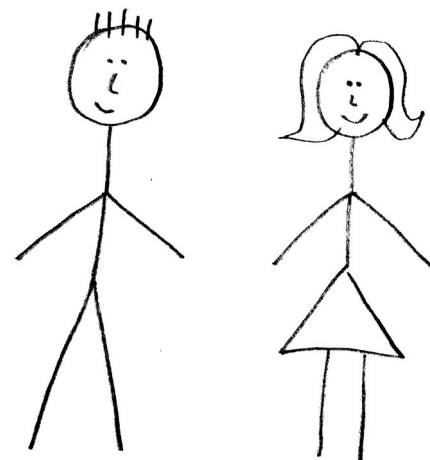
Cost: £2748

Aims/Outcomes: Pupils with SEMH needs make good progress in school.

Wellbeing



Breakfast/After-school Care: Free places for those most in need of breakfast or after-school care.

Cost: £500

Aims/Outcomes: Improved attendance at school. Basic needs are met and children are ready to learn.

2x SMTA: Additional support for vulnerable pupils who struggle to access play opportunities independently.

Cost: £6696

Aims/Outcomes: Pupils are included in all playtimes and behaviour improves leading to more settled learning on return to class.

Family Support Worker: Working with families and children to provide pastoral care.

Cost: £12,583.68

Aims/Outcomes: Pupils with additional needs supported through SAF. Pupils happier at home and at school and more able to engage with learning.

Education Welfare Officer: Working with parents/carers to improve attendance and punctuality.

Cost: £857

Aims/Outcomes: Improved attendance for FSM pupils. Attendance gap closes. Pupils in school and learning.

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Arts/Culture week: Pupils have the opportunity to experience new arts and cultural activities.

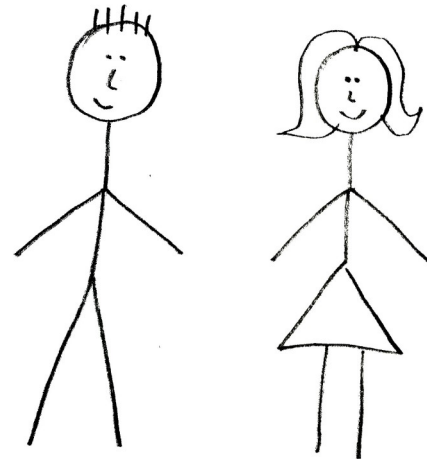
Cost: £2000

Aims/Outcomes: Improved arts skills and access to cultural literacy.

Enrichment/Engagement



Additional opportunities for trips/visits: Pupils will attend additional visits alongside those provided to whole school.

Cost: £6000

Aims/Outcomes: Pupils will not be limited by their access to experience outside of school leading to improved cultural literacy and a broad knowledge base.

Minibuses

Cost: £5000

Aims/Outcomes: The most vulnerable pupils go on additional trips and attend after school events.

Masterclass Project: Pupils are given the opportunity to work with one or more of our professional specialists in residence to develop a skill/passion. Children are able to select from 15 different opportunities.

Cost: £16,000

Aims/Outcomes: To teach Growth Mind set and Grit. Pupils learning that practice + perseverance + hard work = learning.

Sports Week: Pupils have the opportunity to experience new sports and games.

Aims/Outcomes: Improved health, fitness and self esteem. Increased engagement.
