## **Focus children**

As mentioned at the beginning of the academic year our observation process has changed slightly. All children should have had either an 'on entry' observation or a 'long observation' by the end of term 1. Any individual observations are of 'wow' moments where the child has demonstrated a new skill that hasn't been observed before.

During term 2 every week we will choose a select group of children to be a 'focus child'. All this means is that we will be looking to push their learning forward and document any new skills they have learnt from their next steps. At the end of the week when your child has been a focus, you will receive an observation named 'long observations'.

If your child is just joining Little Forest you will receive a document on tapestry called 'on entry' observations at the end of term. This will include all of the learning they have shown us since they started and gives us a baseline of where they are and how to plan for their next steps.
